The Friends Annual General Meeting took place on Monday 20th March 2023. Despite the weather being wet and windy, there was a good turnout, including several non-members. The President of The Friends, Sir Michael Fallon, chaired proceedings and conducted the election of officers and members of the Executive Committee. The Chairman, Kenneth Ludlam, gave a summary of the year's activities and, as Acting Honorary Treasurer, also reported on the Statement of Accounts. Once the formal part of the evening was concluded, Nick White gave a very entertaining talk which brought to life the history of

the Isley family, a number of whom were Lords of the Manor in Sundridge in the 15th and 16th centuries. The church is fortunate to have brasses of three of them, as well as a splendid tomb chest of another. Refreshments were served after the talk.

The Friends will be assisting with a Coronation event on Sunday 7th May serving refreshments after a special Morning Service; an exhibition entitled "Royals, Rectors & Rogues" will be available to view. Everyone will be welcome from 10 30am.



## National events

#### Saturday 6th May - Coronation Service

The centrepiece of the Coronation weekend is the Westminster Abbey Service due to take place in the morning. The Service will be conducted by the Archbishop of Canterbury and the Service will reflect the Monarch's role today and look towards the future, while being rooted in longstanding traditions and pageantry.

#### Sunday 7th May - Coronation Big Lunch

Communities will come together to arrange street parties, gatherings in parks, gardens, and community spaces to mark the Coronation.

#### Sunday 7th May - Coronation Concert

On Sunday a special Coronation Concert will take place at Windsor Castle, produced, staged, and broadcast live by the BBC. The BBC will arrange for several thousand pairs of tickets to be made available via a public ballot. The audience will also include volunteers from The King and The Queen Consort's many charity affiliations. The centrepiece of the Coronation Concert, 'Lighting up the Nation', will see the country join together in celebration as iconic locations across the United Kingdom are lit up using projections, lasers, drone displays and illuminations.

#### Monday 8th May - The Big Help Out

This event is being organised by The Together Coalition and will include support from partners such as the Royal Voluntary Service, Faith Groups from around the United Kingdom, and the Scouts. This initiative will highlight the positive impact volunteering has on communities and the satisfaction it can bring to people giving up their time to volunteer and bring about change. Recalling His Majesty's lifelong dedication to public service, supported by The Queen Consort and other Members of the Royal Family, it is hoped that this initiative will provide an opportunity for communities to come together and support a whole range of volunteering initiatives to create a lasting legacy.

## The Fenland Black Oak Table at Rochester Cathedral

See the spectacular 13 metre table made from 5,000-year-old fossilised wood – on display in the Main Nave until March 2024.

An incredible 13 metre long table created from 5,000 year old fossilised black oak has now arrived at Rochester Cathedral.

In 2012, a 13.2 metre section of a giant black oak tree was found deep in the peat in a field in East Anglia where it had laid undisturbed for 5,000 years. It is believed the tree would have been an immense 55 metres tall when alive. For comparison, modern day oak trees are around 20 metres. For 10 years a team of privately funded specialist crafts people worked to create this stunning table. The Fenland Black Oak Project have preserved this magnificent tree for perpetuity for future generations to admire and use. It was finished in 2022 and commemorates the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. It has only been on display once before at Ely Cathedral.

The table is not just something to look at - it was created for the Nation. Throughout the year a programme of events will take place using the table including dinners

and family activities. The cathedral would love to hear from you if you've got ideas for activities or events using the table.

It will be on display until March 2024. Admission is free during the day but charges may apply for evenings and special events.



# Fundridge - Around Europe in 80 minutes

It's a testament to the villagers' willingness to want to come together to chat, eat and drink that within 10 days of releasing the 1st of Fundridge Sundridge's events of 2023 that the 'Around Europe in 80 minutes' was sold out.


