News from Sundridge and Brasted CE Primary School

Greetings from Sundridge & Brasted CE Primary School
We hope everyone enjoyed the Coronation festivities
and the Sundridge street party. We were quite busy
ourselves!

We held a 'Design a Coin' competition, asking the children to create a new coin and write an explanation for their design. Lots of children joined in with wonderfully colourful and thoughtful entries. We awarded prize for the best entry per class and an overall winner for the school. All entries were displayed on the front fence for the Coronation weekend. We hope you were able to see them before the rain arrived.



For a celebratory lunch, the children decorated their crowns and the hall was festooned with bunting and flags creating a Coronation party atmosphere.

In our whole school Coronation project we focused on Design & Technology. Our youngest children designed and created a Coronation Tea Party making sandwiches, carrot, cucumber and pepper sticks and fairy cakes fit for a King! Our eldest children designed a cam toy to create a hand-powered mechanism that was used to animate a scene that included King Charles. Hedgehogs designed and created carriages fit for a new King and Owl class designed pneumatic animals. All the children worked hard and their creations were superb!







In other news, we have taken our youngest children to swimming lessons at Kemsing Primary School and will continue next term with the older children. We are so grateful to Mr Debono for helping us transport the children each week and to Chevening for lending us their minibus!

Owl class have been travelling to Sevenoaks School to study drama, led by Sevenoaks staff and students. The children are thoroughly enjoying the sessions which are so creative and a lot of fun!

In Forest School the children have learnt how to source natural ingredients to make Nettle Pakoras, Dandelion Frites and Wild Pesto and how to make bird nests out of sticks, twigs, hay, cotton and moss. Lots of learning and lots of free time to explore and play outdoors!

Our Year 6 children attended 'Safety in Action' which aims to teach the children about some of the dangers they may face as they become more independent. Mr Oates continues to teach ukuleles, our Stay and Play toddler





group is thriving and, as always, we are busy, busy!

We have to say a huge 'thank you' to Reverend Tim for leading our weekly Collective Worship services at St Mary's Church since last September. We know he has been incredibly busy and we are so grateful to him for finding the time to work with us during the past months. We wish him well for the future. He has been wonderful and we do hope he will stay in touch.

We look forward to welcoming Reverend Lynette into our school community next term after she takes up her post as Interim Priest in Charge for Sundridge with Ide Hill and Toys Hill, and Brasted. Lynette has already agreed to lead Collective Worship at St Mary's and, as always, we will be inviting our families to join us for the services.

Report from the Friends of St Mary's


The Friends of St Mary's were delighted to contribute to the Coronation Service at St Mary's Sundridge on Sunday 7th May by providing refreshments. After watching the grandeur of the Coronation ceremony in Westminster Abbey the previous day with its unfamiliar liturgy, it was a perfect contrast to recite the well-known words of the service and sing lustily the patriotic hymns. The Rev Adie McCall welcomed the Forest Church group at the beginning of the service and, in place of a sermon, gave the congregation a chance to reflect on the Coronation with their neighbours in the pews. The Forest Church children returned to the service at the end and delighted us with the crowns they had made from flowers found in the churchyard and with their special song. Refreshments provided and served by the Friends' Committee were enjoyed by an enthusiastic number after the service. There was the opportunity to view the splendid "Royals, Rectors & Rogues" exhibition in the Plender Chapel which had been curated by Barbara Lockey, with assistance from Althea Chapman and additional input from Rita Hutty and Nicki Ludlam. Special mention must also be made of the exquisite flower arrangements in the church and Tower Room, the wonderful bellringing and George's fine accompaniment to our hymn-singing.







A group of The Friends visited Biggin Hill Memorial Museum on 18th May and were given tours of both the museum and the chapel by extremely informative volunteer guides. The extensive display of RAF and other memorabilia in the museum was fascinating and the history of the chapel was quite a revelation. We were also able to view the special exhibition entitled "Women as War-Hidden Heroes of WWII" which featured the work of the Air Transport Auxiliary (ATA) and the Women's Auxiliary Airforce (WAAF). Tea and cake at the end of the tours were very welcome – it was warm enough to sit outside and watch the aircraft movements on the runway. We then returned to The Red House, Sundridge where, by kind permission of Nigel and Jane Belle, we had the pleasure of hearing a talk by Bob Ogley entitled "Biggin on the Bump", based on the anecdotes contained in his inspiring book of the same name. Bob drew our attention to the popularity of The White Hart in Brasted as a place where pilots could relax after their sorties and these





gatherings often moved on to The Red House later in the evening as the twin daughters of the house were members of the ATA. Bob is an incredibly gifted speaker and we were enthralled by his tales. The evening concluded with drinks and nibbles and much chat about what a splendid day it had been.







Brasted, Ide Hill and Sundridge Gardening Society

Sorry, no photos this month! However, we were all grateful that Tessa Allen kindly stepped in with her talk on "Small Garden Designs, Plants and Maintenance".

It was lovely to see Tessa again at our May meeting of the Gardening Society and to listen to her talk on "Small Gardens and Small Spaces". She began by asking us to consider the shape of our garden, especially the lawn, and suggested that there are other shapes apart from a rectangle with a narrow boarder around the edge. A circular lawn is very attractive and an S-shaped lawn takes the eye away and makes the garden appear bigger. Tessa asked us not to be precious about our lawns - clover in a lawn is very beneficial and she even urged us to follow the nationwide "No Mow in May" scheme when we just leave the grass to grow, which encourages a greater variety of plant and animal species.

Tessa then went on to give us some ideas of different plants that we might grow in different areas, for example in shady areas, plants for full sun and plants that are good for ground cover. We finished the evening with a question and answer session and even discussed the merits of a robot lawn mower!!!

Sundridge Coronation weekend events

Over the weekend of the Coronation, Sundridge with Ide Hill Parish Council held two events in Sundridge village. The first was a Coronation Street Party on Sunday 7th and the second was a Village Clean Up event on Monday 8th. It was fantastic to see the village come together again and enjoy a wonderful sunny fun weekend.

For Sundridge it all started on Wednesday evening when the working party set to work putting the Coronation bunting along Church Road and the Main Road, which made for a very colourful sight over the weekend.



Then, on the morning of Sunday 7th May, Church Road was closed and the working party arrived en masse to set up farm trailers, the old cart, tables, chairs, BBQs and the Childrens' play area. Thank you to our local schools for their support as the tables and chairs were loaned to the village by Radnor House for the adults and Sundridge and Brasted School for the children. All those who arrived to help decorate the road did a fantastic job putting out all the Coronation paraphernalia to give the road a real party feel. Thank you to Reiss Jefferies for the



wonderful balloon arch she so kindly made and donated for the event. Thanks go also to Kerry Booker, Jason Hodge, Helen Wilson, Dean Gregory, John Evans and James Evans for the use of their vehicles and fencing, along with Jess and The White Horse team for the loan of their freezer, as well as donating power, facilities and 1st prize for the adults' cake competition.

At 1pm the street party commenced and the village then enjoyed five hours of laughter, free food, music and dancing. Standing on the beautifully decorated farm trailer Sophie Mckinnon sang throughout the day a range of songs from over the years which had several of the villagers up on their feet dancing away. Big thanks to Chris Ashworth for providing the sound equipment, ensuring everyone could enjoy the music.

The BBQ team, led by Charlie Watmough, did a stellar job of cooking over 350 burgers and sausages, meat and veggie throughout the whole event. Thanks to all our chefs - Graham Hughes, Julian Parkin, John Banbrook, Melvin De Bono, Chris Hodgkins, Simon Wilson and Gerard O'Reilly. Free hot and cold soft drinks were also available throughout the day, donated by Martin at the Village Shop. A big thank you also to all the villagers that donated food for the event. We had a brilliant, delicious spread to enjoy. Thanks to Gill Hughes, Fiona Parkin and Alison MacMillan for managing all of the food stalls throughout the day.



The children also had a great time climbing on the farm cart and enjoying the children's activities including giant toys, splat the ears and decorating crowns. Thank you to Tristan Philpot for again allowing the use of his drive as the location for all the children's activities.

At 4pm Rev Lynette Leithead, the new parish Priestin-Charge, Andrea Hodge from the Social Club and Jess Smith-Reid from The White Horse pub then presented the prizes for the Coronation cake decorating competition after a tricky round of judging. The quality of the cakes



entered was truly amazing. Big congratulations to Gill Hughes who took 1st place and won a 3-course meal for two at The White Horse donated by Jess, Helen Wilson for 2nd place who won a 2-course meal for two at The Stanhope donated by Matt and Ana and Elizabeth Barker for 3rd prize who won a family picnic blanket donated by the Parish Council. In the children's competition there were some equally excellent entries with all getting to take home a prize.



Parish Council Chairman John Evans then gave a speech thanking all those who helped make the event and the year possible in the village. He presented the village with a Coronation rose to commemorate the occasion. The rose has been planted on Coronation Garden next to the Jubilee rose for all the village to enjoy.

At 6pm the street party came to a close and the village did itself proud with the pack-down happening in record time. Once again thank you to Mick from Tiffany Plant with his road sweeper to make sure there was nothing left behind to show we'd ever been there. Many of the village residents then continued the party into the evening at the club and the pub, watching the Coronation Concert together. While we are also pleased to say there were no first aid requirements on the day, we would like to thank Dr Lara Belle, Sherre Kempton and Gill Hughes for keeping a watchful eye over us all during the event, ready to help if required.



On Monday 8th several of the villagers then turned out again to help litter-pick all over the village, give the white posts along the main road a fresh coat of paint and clean the Coronation memorial and square. The group achieved a phenomenal amount in roughly 3 hours, with lorry tyres, road signs and traffic cones among some of the rubbish pulled from the river. Special thanks to Chris Hodgkins and Helen Wilson for supplying and operating the jet wash that has left the Coronation square floor and walls sparklingly clean.



The afternoon culminated in the launching of the new duck house, excellently named Sundridge Duckingham Palace, on to the now litter free Mill Pond. The duck house was group-funded by village residents through the Sundridge and Ide Hill support group and we hope it will make a lovely new home for the new ducklings that have taken up residence at the pond since John Evans restored it to its original glory.



As you can see from the list of thanks, these events take a lot of work, and the Parish Council would like to thank whole-heartly all those that helped make the weekend's events possible both in Sundridge and in Goathurst Common. Without all of the villages' volunteers events like these and many of the other activities in the villages would not be possible.

Councillor Vacancies

We currently have two vacancies on the Parish Council, one for the ward of Sundridge and one for the ward of Ide Hill. Anyone who wishes to be considered for this important position is invited to contact the Clerk (clerk@sundridgewithidehill-pc.gov.uk).

The Drake Oil Syndicate

Some years ago, Campbell Simm, an Edenbridge resident, had the idea of joining with a group of local friends to achieve better buying prices for domestic heating oil while at the same time negotiating a charity discount with the supplier which would provide funds to help support an Edenbridge children's charity together with local churches.

Today the syndicate has approximately 700 members and generates an annual charity pot of between £10,000 and £12,000. Each quarter, a syndicate price is agreed with Certas Energy, the oil supplier, which will be as close as possible to the second lowest price found. Syndicate members are then notified of this price and have to decide, without any obligation, whether they want a delivery on these terms. The deliveries take place over the next two weeks and Certas then credit the charity account.

At the end of the year the charity funds are then distributed with just under half going to Edenbridge charities and the rest split among the local churches. The three churches in our Parish regularly benefit.

Certas Energy delivers to the Drake Syndicate in January, April, August and November. Certas Energy will still deliver outside these times but such deliveries are at their prevailing price.
