

# Brasted, Ide Hill and Sundridge Gardening Society

March winds and April showers together with hail storms have given us gardeners a challenging time so far in 2023. The heavy rain did not prevent Philip Oostenbrink from travelling from the Kent Coast to give the talk at the Ide hill Village Hall on "Walmer Castle and Gardens".

Philip began by introducing himself as a young gardener from the Netherlands, who later gained experience in several garden centres in England before becoming the Head Gardener at Walmer Castle, unfortunately in 2020 with a challenging time during the start of lockdown.

He described the History of Walmer Castle: when it was built during the reign of Henry VIII with several famous appointed Lord Wardens, including The Duke of Wellington with his famous boots and the late Queen Mother.

Philip's present project is creating a natural area for the gardens at Walmer which he demonstrated by draining a large water area, giving away the goldfish, sealing the weak boundaries before adding fresh water to encourage successfully wild amphibians and insects. He is gradually growing more natural plants and has produced a book entitled "The Jungle Book" to emphasize his project in creating a jungle garden. I was particularly intrigued by a plant grown in the greenhouse called "The Queen of the Night" which only flowers at night with a distinct perfume.

Philip gave the members a very interesting talk supported by colourful slides which has encouraged his audience to visit the castle and gardens during the summer months. My sister visited Walmer together with the private beach where an unusual moss has established its growth. She particularly enjoyed a visit to the garden of the late Queen Mother.

Our next meeting will be held at the Ide Hill Village Hall on Wednesday 10th May, refreshments at 7.45pm and the talk at 8.00. Our speaker George Lockwood has sadly developed cancer and will be unable to join us in May. It is hoped that Tessa Allen will be able be with us with her talk "Making Changing to our Gardens".

Let us hope that we will enjoy the summer climate after the Coronation of King Charles III.

#### Coronation in Ide Hill

Ide Hill will be celebrating the Coronation of His Majesty King Charles III with a "Street Party" picnic event on Goathurst Common Recreation Ground on Sunday 7th May 2023, from 12:30 to 3:30. Supported by the Sundridge with Ide Hill Parish Council, this family picnic event is being organised by the Friends of Goathurst Common to raise awareness of their fundraising to improve the playground equipment on the Rec.

The event is open to all Ide Hill and Sundridge residents and will include bouncy castles, kids' crafts, Beat the Goalie, "Goat" hurling and other traditional entertainments. There will be a tea and cake marquee, children's refreshments and a Beer and Pimms stall but feel free to bring a picnic for the family to enjoy. Because of the poor mobile signal, card payments will not be possible but £5 "fun cards" for use where required can be purchased from the Ide Hill Community Shop or in cash on the day.

Parking on site is for those with blue badges only (please email *martyn.fribbens@sundridgewithidehill-pc.gov.uk* for access) and the road will be closed to avoid congestion. If you choose not to walk to Goathurst Common Rec then parking in Stubbs Wood car park or surrounding roads is advised. If you don't know where the Rec is, follow Gracious Lane out of Ide Hill and turn left at Stubbs Wood car park. The first left (at the postbox) leads to the Rec. Signage will be available on the day.

### Coronation in Sundridge Sunday 7th May – Sundridge Street Party

Sundridge with Ide Hill Parish Council would like to invite all residents of the parish to celebrate the Kings Coronation at a street party on Sunday 7th May between 13:00 – 18:00 on Church Road, Sundridge. # Securing a future for Sevenoaks' Swifts

Securing a future for Sevenoaks' Swifts The 2023 Sevenoaks Swift Survey



Common Swifts are the Olympians of the animal world, no other bird can reach such fast speeds and travel for years without touching down. These incredible birds nest in nooks and crannies under the eaves of our buildings, performing their aerial acrobatics over our summer skies.

Sadly, across the UK, numbers have halved in the last two decades, in part because there are far fewer places for them to nest in new or refurbished buildings, and this is an area which we aim to investigate and hopefully mitigate over coming few years.

The first step will be to identify where they are to be seen in summer. Swifts return to this country to breed at the end of April or beginning of May, leaving again for sunnier climes in July. There are two aspects to the sighting of Swifts: on summer nights they can be seen high in the sky hawking for insects to feed themselves and their offspring but this does not necessarily indicate that the birds are nesting in the area since they can travel long distances to find flights of insects, before returning to their nests to feed their young.

House Martin White rump White rump Forked tail A better guide to where Swifts are nesting is observing small groups flying no higher than rooftop height, emitting screaming calls - this is a good indication that they are nesting nearby and is where we come in. We can allocate a local patch measuring roughly 500 x 500 metres to each volunteer, centred on your address, providing a map of the roads within that patch.

All you need to do is to walk around your own area at least once in May, June and July. Your allocated 500 metre square contains potential nest sites i.e. buildings where Swifts might nest in the roof spaces, often without anyone knowing!

Surveys should be carried out in the evening under still, dry conditions, when low flying Swift activity near nests is at its peak, ideally between 7.30 pm and 9.30 pm and timed to finish before dusk - at other times the Swifts could be feeding many miles away from their nests. Negative results are as important as positive ones: if you know a property where Swifts are known to nest, this should also be recorded. We can provide you with more details, a map detailing the roads involved around your property and survey forms. All we are asking is that you record any sightings or report negative results.

#### What happens next?

Thankfully there is one solution to the Swifts' plight – making sure that new development contains integral Swift nest boxes (bricks with cavities in which the birds can nest). There is an important role for the Council to play in providing clear guidance for planners and developers to make sure that new development in the borough includes Swift bricks and, where is doesn't, requiring their installation through planning conditions.

We may also be able to contact the owners of suitable buildings so that a Swift nest box might be installed and monitored. This depends entirely on information you gather just by walking your local area in 2023.

It is important to report only the Swifts and not House Martins.
