### 1st October 1933 to 30th August 2023

Lifelong village resident, Pat Murch (née Brown) died on 30th August 2023.



She was born, the second of five children, in Church Road, Sundridge in 1933. Apart from a few years in Deal when first married to her Royal Marine husband Jack (later a Sevenoaks postman), she lived in Sundridge all her life.

She went to the village school, sang in the church choir and helped to run the Sunday School. After leaving Tonbridge Technical School for Girls, she spent some time in the Territorial Army, became a shorthand

typist and later worked for a number of years in the village shop and Post Office. She met Jack through a mutual friend of his sister, but they were penpals for over a year before they finally met each other.

They were married in Sundridge church in 1955.

Pat and Jack were great supporters of village events, often seen dancing to live bands at local fairs in their younger years. Jack was the Sundridge postman after leaving the Royal Marines until he retired. Following his

death in 2006, Pat devoted her time to their 4 children and 7 grandchildren and their partners. Recent years of ill health meant she was no longer seen out in the village.

She missed having a chat with local friends and neighbours but in latter years enjoyed her weekly trip to the Day Centre at Edenbridge War Memorial Hospital, where she tried hard not to beat others at scrabble and gave everyone a chance to answer the quiz questions before she told them the answers.

She was never happier than when her family visited or took her out in the wheelchair, especially to the seaside for fish and chips. She will be sorely missed by so many. Her funeral will be held at St Mary's Church, Sundridge on Friday 6th October at 12 noon.

Our older children are enjoying weekly trips to Sevenoaks School to take part in wonderful Science and Design & Technology lessons led by Sevenoaks School staff. We are very fortunate to have access to their excellent facilities and equipment. Thank you to Sevenoaks School for offering their time and resources to the local community!

Our Year 6 children prepared their applications for the roles of Head Boy and Head Girl, delivering them to the whole school prior to a period of voting. ### Brasted, Ide Hill and Sundridge Gardening Society

There was no sign of the Yeti, not even any footprints when the Gardening Society visited the Riverhill Himalayan Gardens, but we did spend a very enjoyable afternoon with Misako, the Head Gardener. She told us that Riverhill has been in the Rogers family for six generations and that one of the predecessors of the present family was an avid plant collector and botanist. He was a contemporary of Charles Darwin with whom he corresponded and discussed their findings, and it was he who brought the plants and trees to Riverhill and started to make the garden what it is today.

Misako took us to the walled garden first, which is full of symbolism, an unusual water feature and a Himalayan mountain hut. We then walked through to the rock garden, not a traditional one with alpine plants but a beautiful shaded area with numerous ferns, a metasequoia tree (which at one time was thought to be extinct, but this specimen was brought as a seedling at a plant fair at Olympia in the 1950s) and a place that had been especially opened up to give a wonderful view over the Weald.

For the energetic amongst us, there was quite a climb to the top of the hill for an even greater panoramic vista, but for the rest of us a gentle stroll downhill to the cafe for a very enjoyable cuppa!
